



FATHER LACOMBE CARE CENTRE: Kathleen Robinson

A Reserved Eucharist service is held at the Father Lacombe Care Centre in Midnapore on Sunday afternoon every four weeks, hosted by our clergy and volunteers. Volunteers are needed to assist residents in getting to the chapel, as well as finding the correct page for the lyrics for the hymns we sing. This service an uplifting experience for the residents who attend and is an important way to serve our community.

PASTORAL CARE MINISTRIES

PASTORAL CARE TEAM: Betty Nadurak

The purpose of this ministry is to help everyone feel cared for and loved as part of our Parish family. We don't want anyone to "fall through the cracks," and feel that no one knows or cares. This taking care of each other can be done informally, checking on each other. It can also be done more formally as part of the Pastoral Care Team — the ministry of human presence. Special training is available. On behalf of the congregation, the team members contact those in the parish in whatever their own circumstances, so that Jesus Christ can be present and bring healing, compassion and understanding.

It is a ministry requires someone who is willing to be present, and actively listening to the person, but not counselling.

QUILT/SHAWL PRAYER MINISTRY: Laura Anne Fink

This group meets the third Wednesday of each month from 1 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. The purpose is to make quilts or shawls to be given to those who are sick or have suffered a loss — or also in times of celebration. The quilts and shawls are a way of wrapping each person in prayer to let them know that they are in God's keeping and are loved. If you know of anyone who would like to receive a shawl or quilt please let us know at the Parish Office.

NEWCOMERS: Robbie Coller

Welcoming newcomers to St. Paul's is a multi-step process that we hope begins with a warm greeting from the parishioners they sit beside. Once they have filled out a newcomer's card, a personalized welcome letter and other materials are sent and phone contact will be made if requested.

WORSHIP SCHEDULE

10:00 a.m. Contemporary Eucharist

Our main Sunday service is a lively contemporary language Eucharist with music, Nursery, Sunday School and a special prayer team.

Wednesday Service: 9:30 a.m. Morning Prayer.

COMMUNION

We invite everyone to the Lord's Table. To receive the Bread, extend palms, crossed and upward; when offered the chalice, please assist in guiding it by holding the bottom edge with your thumb and fingers. If you prefer, you may receive only the bread or the wine. We believe Christ is fully present in either element. If you prefer to not receive the Sacrament, you may ask for a blessing in the traditional manner of crossing your hands over your chest.

ALTAR GUILD: Barb Leinweber

Members of the Altar Guild prepare the church for worship services by setting out and then cleaning up the communion vessels, polishing brass, arranging or setting out flowers, replacing candles, marking Bible and Altar Book places and keeping the linen washed and ironed.

The volunteers work in rotation, which turns out to be about once a month. Set-up can be done Friday or Saturday as suits your schedule. During the Christmas and Easter seasons there are extra shifts, which are covered on a volunteer basis. There are two meetings a year, at which time all members get together to discuss issues, idea, and the future while getting to know each other and keeping aware of the importance of this group.

New members are needed - male or female - as many hands make light work. If interested in this quiet, behind-the-scenes ministry to our community, please contact Barb or the Parish Office at 403-256-1428.

SIDESPEOPLE: Suzanne Wray

At every service one or two people are needed to hand out leaflets, make people feel welcome and comfortable, count the congregation, collect the offering, take up the bread and wine for communion, usher the congregation up for communion and refill the cardholders in the pews.

It requires arriving early on your assigned Sunday to ensure everything is ready, and tidying up before closing the doors after the service ends. Each new sidesperson is given a leaflet detailing duties and help from experienced sidespeople. To volunteer, or for more information, please call Suzanne or the Parish office.

GREETERS: Roxie Hall

The Greeters come about a half hour before the service. The job requires a smiling face, a warm greeting for those arriving, and helping newcomers find name tags and giving them general help. This ministry doesn't require much time but it is very important.

HOMELESS SHELTERS AND AGENCIES: John L'Ecuyer

There are a wide variety of ways we assist many community organizations each year. Several times a year we collect clothing, shoes, toys or small household (dishes, towels, bed linens, etc.) items. We also deliver leftover food from events to the Calgary Dream Centre several times a year. Thank you.

FATHER LACOMBE CARE CENTRE SING -ALONG: Kerry Peters

On Friday mornings there is a Sing-Along for residents of the Father Lacombe Care Centre in Midnapore hosted by St. Paul's volunteers. Volunteers are always appreciated.

FOOD BANK



AUDIO VISUAL TECHNOLOGY: Paul Bourgeois

The screen ministry enhances the visual experience in worship through the use of the Sanctuary screens. This ministry supports the music and worship by ensuring appropriate volume levels while minimizing feedback and other disruptions. People working the soundboard need to arrive at least 20 minutes before the service to set up lapel and hand-held mic as necessary and to set the sound level for the pre-service music. Throughout the service, it is important to anticipate the need to turn mics on and off and to adjust volumes. The board is labeled to make this job easier and first-timers will work with veterans during the service to become familiar with the board's operation. This ministry is not only required for Sunday services but also for other services such as weddings and funerals and other occasional special events.

SERVERS: Cheryl Scott

Those interested in serving must be in Grade 6 or older and go through some training. The time commitment is small, with you arriving about 20 minutes before the service and staying through the service. The schedule is made up about six months at a time.

SACRAMENTAL ASSISTANTS: Ed Mullaney

Each Sunday at the 10:00 a.m. service, two people are needed to help at communion by administering the chalices. This is such a joy, and if you think it is something that might interest you please contact the Parish Office. Training will be provided.

LESSON READERS: Robbie Coller

The requirements for this ministry are the ability to read clearly and slowly in front of a group of people. The schedule is made up well in advance and you are given your reading to prepare. The time commitment is the amount of time you need to prepare and to be at the service early on your scheduled day.

COUNTERS: Roxie Hall

The counters work in teams to tally and record in-person donations each week. Teams work on a rotating preset schedule.

PRAYER MINISTRIES

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE FOR SERVICES: Dinah Breu

Taking a turn to lead the prayers of the people each Sunday morning is a labour of love for a small group of parishioners. If you feel that this is a ministry for you, please get in touch with Dinah at 403-256-1684. Training is offered and guidelines are provided for those who do this.

PRAYER TEAM ON SUNDAYS: Dinah Breu

The Prayer Ministry is a confidential ministry that is in place to provide brief prayer (not counselling) to individuals who desire prayer for themselves or for those close to them. Prayer Teams are available in the chapel most Sunday mornings during and after Communion. Prayer Team members are appointed by the Rector. Each member of the team has covenanted to maintain confidentiality. Each member is fully aware that they are channels of God's peace and love to others and are not operating in their own strength. Everyone who participates in this ministry has been deeply touched and is thankful that it is the Lord who provides the words.

PRAYER CHAIN: Dinah Breu

The Prayer Chain is a confidential, compassionate, caring ministry. Everyone who is involved in this ministry believes in the power of prayer, and that God is in charge of all our lives, because He loves us.

The time commitment for the Prayer Chain varies depending on the need. It works by prayers being passed down a chain of people and then these people lifting the prayers in their own time privately at home.

HOSPITALITY MINISTRIES

The goal of this ministry is to give a generous welcome for our guests and those who are new are to us by providing support, being reliable, sensitive and kind.

The Hospitality Ministry consists of several different types of gatherings such as Ladies Bag Lunch, Men's Breakfast, Fellowship & Food Group, and Secret Friends, as well as several other events throughout the year. We always needvolunteers to help out in any way they can, from setting up tables to providing food to share or washing dishes. If you would like to contribute time to such a rewarding ministry, contact Laura Anne. This is a wonderful way of getting involved in the parish as well as having fellowship and meeting new people.

COFFEE TIME — SUNDAY

Contact: Office

This ministry requires time on Sunday morning as well as some preparation time beforehand. There is a sign up sheet on the board by the kitchen door. You may sign up for any number of times you would like, i.e. once a month, every other month or once a year.

This job requires you to set up for coffee before the service by getting the coffee brewing, setting coffee cups, cream and sugar on the trays and providing any sweets if you would like. After communion. you will need to come out and set everything up in the hall area, make the tea and at the end clean up. There is always help around so you are not on your own.

PRAYER GROUP: Dinah Breu

The main purpose of the Prayer Group is to under gird the Parish with prayer .

We meet:

Second Monday of each month in person at 1:30-2:30 p.m. Fourth Monday of each month via Zoom from 7:30-8:30 p.m.

The group has found a pattern that works well for us. When we arrive, we share any requests with each other. We take turns leading (only if one is comfortable doing so). The leader begins the prayers and then others pray for the various needs and requests that have been brought to us. It is not necessary to pray aloud. Prayers in this group are not formal (as in Sunday Services), but are more in line with what Rosalind Rinker's book called "conversational prayer" - having a conversation with the Lord. The leader signals that Prayer Time is coming to a close by leading the group in the Lord's Prayer after which we say "the Grace." Responsibility for the group is shared by all its members. We do not have a "leader" as such. Confidentiality is our only rule. We do not discuss prayer requests outside the group with anyone, anytime.

Everyone in the parish is welcome to attend. You are welcome to come to see if it is for you, to come on a drop-in basis, or to come for prayer for yourself. We would be more than happy to have you join us. Even if you have never belonged to a prayer group, it is still alright to come!

Our Worship Is...

- Biblical. Each service contains four scripture readings, one each from the Old Testament, Psalms, Epistles and Gospels. Much of the rest of the service is taken directly from the Bible.
- Sacramental. We believe that God is actively present in the world and in us. In the sacraments we realize God's presence and favour towards us. Through the sacraments our sins are forgiven, our minds are enlightened, our hearts stirred and our wills strengthened. The two primary sacraments are Baptism and Eucharist. Other sacraments are Confirmation, Ordination, Holy Matrimony, Reconciliation of a Penitent, and Unction or anointing of the sick.
- A Celebration of God's Love Our service is an act of remembrance of the mighty acts of God on our behalf throughout history; makes God's presence an immediate and personal reality; fosters unity and community with all God's people and equips us to serve God in the world.
- Highly participatory. The clergy and congregation share together actively in prayer and response throughout the service. Participation in our Eucharist is open to all who are baptized.
- Poetic in Nature. Words, music and actions produce reverence and beauty as well as relevance and community.
- Both Ancient and Modern. The basic forms of our services were in place by the third century. Although they have undergone many revisions since then to meet the needs of different times and places, we value tradition and our connection with those who preceded us in faith. Our worship is thus both catholic and reformed.

MUSIC MINISTRIES

Come and join us for our bi-monthly evening of song featuring our own St. Paul's Stringers. There will also be an open mic available. This is a family-friendly event.

HAND CHIMES: Annette Pingot

St. Paul's has a three-octave set of Suzuki Tone Chimes that needs a group of 11-15 people to make them ring. The 'Ding-a-Lings' have played at Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve, Easter, Pentecost and Baptism services, as well as performed for fundraising events.

First-time chimers will be given an orientation session before their first practice. The orientation will cover the basics of ringing and dampening techniques, counting and the format of our colour-coded music. No prior formal music training is required, although it is useful. Practices begin about six weeks prior to the event date and are scheduled for one hour at times that are convenient to the ringers.
